This is a procedure which takes a great deal of time and effort (mostly because of all the Mexican custom restrictions and requirements). Usually, I am so relieved when I get to the other side of the border, where my partners await to help me. Often, these partners express interest in wishing that they could help us in the U.S. because they know it's a great deal of work. My sentiment is always the same: I wish you could help us in the U.S. too!!' I must admit that I find myself asking why it seems so hard to solicit help from people who are on my side of the border. I submit this question to you, and ask that you would make it a matter of prayer for Voice of the Bride. Please pray that the laborers would not be few in these days, for truly, we need laborers! In addition to that, please pray that I would learn how to better steward delegation and recruitment in order to best establish a lasting, and a fruitful ministry.

More for prayer: I (Wayne) need prayer for physical stamina, both for endurance, as well as pain management (physically, throwing huge bags of bread is a challenge). Also, our finances have been faithful and consistent (almost 2 years since we went full time), and we are so grateful for that! However, we have seen some measure of funding decline.
