Incredible INDIA, I (Wayne) would have to agree! My time there was truly inspiring, encouraging and enlightening. The west coast area, by the Arabian Sea, where we held the Living Waters training (the largest attended international one yet), was colonized by Portugal in 1505 and continued for over 400 years. An explosion of Christianity occurred beginning with one Portuguese Jesuit missionary St Francis Xavier known to be responsible for thirty thousand new converts. He was considered to be one of the greatest missionaries since Apostle Paul, the only other to have led more converts for Christ in history.

India being a predominant Hindu nation, and aside from a percentage being also Islam, is only 2.3% Christian. Being a Christian visiting as a foreigner is rather unorthodox, and some extra precautions were taken to keep us safe. Being of sensitive nature, that is all I can really say in this public update. But I will share, that personally witnessing precautions that our Christian brothers and sisters in India have to take, and the risks they face because of their faith, was a clear reminder of how fortunate we are in America for our many freedoms that we just celebrated this 4th of July.

. . . were a few of the things spoken/prayed over me by the small group of men I led each day of the training. These men were an honor to meet. To have them entrust me with the vulnerabilities of their hearts, as they shared their struggles as husbands, fathers, sons, leaders, was priceless. This is no small task to overcome, living in a third world nation, where your class as a citizen is governed by many factors - wealth - skin shade - religion - family values etc. While this may sound familiar to our culture, trust me-the depth of the stories I heard are on a heavier level among these good men and women our team was privileged to minister to. Rejections from families due to conversion to Christianity - great amounts of pressure for higher education achievements - arranged marriages - difficulties of priesthood - prejudices experienced toward caste systems (social hierarchy that divides people into hereditary groups with varying levels of social status and occupation) - were among some of these heavy things.

Our team consisted of 8 Americans, 9 Filipinos, 19 Indians, leading 100 participants through many teachings of applying God's word and His intentions for how we bear His image as men and women. In particular, how we relate with one another as fathers, mothers, sons, daughters, congregants, co-workers, community dwellers. Also finding FREEDOM from addictions, hidden sin, physical and sexual abuse, generational curses, unforgiveness - ALL important for learning to live in harmony and how to model Christ to a world that needs Him like never before.

India is fast paced with a lot of beautiful culture in the land, the people, AND the food! I had more rice and curry than I've had in a life time - well maybe not, but I had a LOT and each of the curries were different and yummy. My Mexican friends may not believe me but I tried and


